Part II of the MFMII Story: 1998-2008

This decade marked continued expansion of the MFMII program from serving 2,500 students in 1998 to reaching 4,000 children in 2001 in three school districts: Fremont, Newark, and Castro Valley Unified along with the addition of the Extended Day Care Centers (EDCC) in Pleasanton and Dublin. MFMII began training the EDCC teachers who then shared the music with children during their before and after school program.







Volunteer recruitment has been ongoing but what is essential is caring, dedicated, unselfish parents and community members who stepped up and took our training classes to make the musical difference in children's lives and their own because that's what music does! Our Docents are the core and heart of MFMII because they directly impact the children! Read More
